About the Service

Advent is a season of both quiet reflection and joyful expectation, a season that has two meanings for Christians: First, preparation for the anniversary of the Lord Jesus's first coming, his birth to the Virgin Mary two thousand years ago, culminating in our celebration of Christmas, the feast lasting twelve days from December 25 to January 5. Second, a time to contemplate the eternal coming and presence of Christ in the world with the eventual second coming of our Lord at the end of time, when Christ will come in great power and glory and the kingdom of God will be fully realized. The double emphasis on both the first and second comings of Christ gives the season its unique mixture of joy and awe.

Originating from King's College, Cambridge, England a hundred years ago, this service of readings and music is one of the glories of the Anglican tradition, of which we are a part. The heart of the service continues to this day, that is, the retelling of the Christian story of faith from the fall of Adam to the coming of the Word Incarnate. Each carol or hymn illumines the lesson that it is paired with.

The texts for the Lessons are from the traditional King James Bible. The words for the Choir Carols are included to enhance your listening. The music for the congregational hymns are included in the program.

This evening's offering: there is an offering basket at the entrance of the church. The proceeds of this evening's offering will help support the music ministry of the St. Barnabas' Choral Scholars. We thank you.



BIDDING PRAYER

The Priest bids the people to prayer with these words

Beloved in Christ, as we await the great festival of Christmas, let us prepare ourselves so that we may be shown its true meaning. Let us hear, in lessons from holy Scripture, how the prophets of Israel foretold that God would visit and redeem his waiting people. Let us rejoice, in our carols and hymns, that the good purpose of God is being mightily fulfilled.

Let us celebrate the promise that our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ will bring all people and all things into the glory of God's eternal kingdom. The blind receive sight, and the lame walk, the lepers are cleansed, and the deaf hear; the dead are raised up, and the poor have the Gospel preached to them.

But first let us pray: for the world which God so loves; for those who have not heard the good news of God, or who do not believe it; for those who walk in darkness and the shadow of death; and for the church in this place and everywhere, that it may be freed from all evil and fear, and may in pure joy lift up the light of the love of God.

These prayers and praises let us humbly offer to God in the words which Christ himself taught us:

All Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy Name, thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, for ever and ever. Amen.

Priest Almighty God bless us with his grace; Christ give us the joys of everlasting life; and to the fellowship of the citizens above may the King of Angels bring us all.
