Welcome to our in-person indoor worship service. In order to worship safely we will:

- Have doors and windows open to provide fresh airflow,
- Be limited to those who have no COVID-19 symptoms and have not recently tested positive for COVID.
- Recommend that a mask be worn at all times, however, masks are optional for those who have been vaccinated and are healthy,
- Please note that we do not require COVID vaccination to attend worship at St. Barnabas.

Distribution of bread and wine:

- Starting from the balcony and then the back of the room, Ushers will invite you forward to receive the bread and wine.
- Then you may take a small bowl of wine from the tray and consume the wine before returning to your seat. Empty bowls may be placed in the baskets along the side of the room.
- If you prefer, instead of an individual bowl, you may drink wine from the common chalice.
- If you are unable to come forward, let the ushers know so the bread can be brought to you.






COLLECT FOR PURITY

The Celebrant says

Almighty God, to you all hearts are open, all desires known, and from you no secrets are hid: Cleanse the thoughts of our hearts by the inspiration of your Holy Spirit, that we may perfectly love you, and worthily magnify your holy Name; through Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

The Collect for Purity is a prayer of preparation.
We bring many things with us into worship, and we ask the Holy Spirit to help us set those distractions aside, even briefly, so that we may focus on our worship of God.

THE LESSONS

The people sit.

FIRST READING: Isaiah 6:1-8

A Reading from the Prophet Isaiah.

In the year that King Uzziah died, I saw the Lord sitting on a throne, high and lofty; and the hem of his robe filled the temple. Seraphs were in attendance above him; each had six wings: with two they covered their faces, and with two they covered their feet, and with two they flew. And one called to another and said:

"Holy, holy, holy is the Lord of hosts; the whole earth is full of his glory."

The pivots on the thresholds shook at the voices of those who called, and the house filled with smoke. And I said: "Woe is me! I am lost, for I am a man of unclean lips, and I live among a people of unclean lips; yet my eyes have seen the King, the Lord of hosts!"

Then one of the seraphs flew to me, holding a live coal that had been taken from the altar with a pair of tongs. The seraph touched my mouth with it and said: "Now that this has touched your lips, your guilt has departed and your sin is blotted out." Then I heard the voice of the Lord saying, "Whom shall I send, and who will go for us?" And I said, "Here am I; send me!"

Our readings are on a pre-set three-year cycle called "The Revised Common Lectionary" or RCL. We are currently in Year C of that three-vear cycle. We respond to the reading of Scripture by thanking God for the gift it is to us.

In this section of his first letter to the early followers of Jesus in Corinth, the Apostle Paul reminds those followers of the death and resurrection of Jesus. He includes both men and women in the group of follows who saw the resurrected

Jesus.

SECOND READING: 1 Corinthians 15:1-11

A Reading from Paul's first letter to the Corinthians.

I would remind you, brothers and sisters, of the good news that I proclaimed to you, which you in turn received, in which also you stand, through which also you are being saved, if you hold firmly to the message that I proclaimed to you--unless you have come to believe in vain.

For I handed on to you as of first importance what I in turn had received: that Christ died for our sins in accordance with the scriptures, and that he was buried, and that he was raised on the third day in accordance with the scriptures, and that he appeared to Cephas, then to the twelve. Then he appeared to more than five hundred brothers and sisters at one time, most of whom are still alive, though some have died.

Then he appeared to James, then to all the apostles. Last of all, as to one untimely born, he appeared also to me. For I am the least of the apostles, unfit to be called an apostle, because I persecuted the church of God. But by the grace of God I am what I am, and his grace toward me has not been in vain. On the contrary, I worked harder than any of them--though

it was not I, but the grace of God that is with me. Whether then it was I or they, so we proclaim and so you have come to believe.

Once while Jesus was standing beside the lake of Gennesaret, and the crowd was pressing in on him to hear the word of God, he saw two boats there at the shore of the lake; the fishermen had gone out of them and were washing their nets. He got into one of the boats, the one belonging to Simon, and asked him to put out a little way from the shore. Then he sat down and taught the crowds from the boat. When he had finished speaking, he said to Simon, "Put out into the deep water and let down your nets for a catch." Simon answered, "Master, we have worked all night long but have caught nothing. Yet if you say so, I will let down the nets."

When they had done this, they caught so many fish that their nets were beginning to break. So they signaled their partners in the other boat to come and help them. And they came and filled both boats, so that they began to sink. But when Simon Peter saw it, he fell down at Jesus' knees, saying, "Go away from me, Lord, for I am a sinful man!" For he and all who were with him were amazed at the catch of fish that they had taken; and so also were James and John, sons of Zebedee, who were partners with Simon. Then Jesus said to Simon, "Do not be afraid; from now on you will be catching people." When they had brought their boats to shore, they left everything and followed him.

And after a moment of silence the Deacon adds a concluding Collect.



With its emphasis on God as creator of the universe, some affectionately call this "the star trek" version of our Eucharist.

Glory to you for ever and ever.

At your command all things came to be: the vast expanse of interstellar space, galaxies, suns, the planets in their courses, and this fragile earth, our island home.

By your will they were created and have their being.

From the primal elements you brought forth the human race, and blessed us with memory, reason, and skill. You made us the rulers of creation. But we turned against you, and betrayed your trust; and we turned against one another.

Have mercy, Lord, for we are sinners in your sight.




People and Celebrant

The original version of this Eucharistic Prayer only listed the Patriarchs (men) from some of the early Old Testament stories. We know that God also honored the women of these stories, so we add them. You may note there are three men and four women. Remember that Leah and Rachel both had Jacob as a husband.

We alternate, by season, between the traditional version of the Lord's Prayer and the contemporary version of the Lord's Prayer. In this season of Epiphany we are using the latter versions which was developed at a cross-denominational conference in in the 1970s.

While not all donations will go to LA, this fund is a critical resource for all Episcopal dioceses experiencing wildfires all over the world. With personnel trained in disaster response and recovery and grants and guidance given directly to churches, Episcopal Relief and Development will ensure that your donation is used according to the highest needs and best practices.

You'll notice both of these are for monetary donations only. At this point, the Episcopal Diocese of Los Angeles has not sent out any requests for other kinds of aid.

AARP TAX AIDE SERVICES – We are once again hosting the Central Coast Tax-Aide folks in the Parish Hall on Thursdays during the tax season. helps taxpayers by preparing US and state income tax returns and ensuring that taxpayers receive all applicable tax credits and deductions. It is a free service that is available to all taxpayers except those with complicated returns such as rental property, with special attention to seniors and those with low or moderate income. EMBODIED SPIRITUAL PRACTICE – Our bodies, or moving centers, are a vital category of spiritual practices. For many years, here at St. Barnabas, Sigrid Long has offered chair yoga, senior fitness, and yoga. Classes are donation based which is usually \$5-10.

BARRE FITNESS CLASS – Join Heidy for a FANTASTIC Barre Sculpt class every Monday and Friday at 10:30am in our St. Barnabas Church parish hall. Barre Sculpt is a mix of Pilates, Yoga, and functional weight and resistance training. This is a low-impact workout that works hard on our muscles, but is kind to our joints. The moves are choreographed and set to great, motivating music. Each energizing, targeted song sculpts, slims, and stretches your entire body. Local studios charge \$20 per class for these types of classes, but we are suggesting just a \$7 donation per class! Bring a mat, 2-3lb weights, a resistance band, and a small Pilates ball for an amazing full body workout. No dance experience required. You're gonna love it.

<u>Friday 4:00 pm CENTERING PRAYER</u> – Each Friday afternoon at 4pm we will hold a Centering Prayer Service. After first gathering for a few minutes, we practice our 20 minutes of silent Centering Prayer. Following the practice, we will be reading and discussing a passage from Hildegard of Bingen, a mystic from the 11th and 12th centuries. She was a mystic (perhaps Germany's first) and a visionary, but she was also a prophet, a reformer, a scientist, an encyclopedist, a composer, and a dramatist – a Renaissance personality well before the Renaissance.

We are using Let There Be Light an edited collection of prayers and writings introducing some of her visions and spiritual insights.
